

Tube strike

RMT, Unite and TSSA members are planning 24-hour strike action on the Tube from 18:30 on Wednesday 8 July. ASLEF drivers are also planning 24-hour strike action on the Tube from 21:30 on Wednesday 8 July. DLR, London Overground and TfL Rail staff are not on strike.

Advice for customers – from the TfL website

If the strike goes ahead, **there will be no Tube service from late afternoon on Wednesday 8 July** and no Tube service at all on Thursday 9 July. Options for Travel to City Hall/The Brigade

VICTORIA

Anyone coming into/out of Victoria Mainline Station could change their destination to London Bridge via East Croydon.

- If your train stops at East Croydon, change there for London Bridge.
- If your train stops at Clapham, either backtrack to East Croydon for London Bridge (easiest option) - or change at Clapham for Waterloo
- If your train is non-stop to/from Victoria, or doesn't go through East Croydon, take the first train to East Croydon and pick up the connection to London Bridge (10 minute walk to City Hall)

Trains run very frequently in the outbound direction until 00.12 – and then every 40 minutes or so throughout the night.

WATERLOO

By Bus. Take the 381 from York Road – Stop V – towards Peckham, stopping at City Hall or the RV1 from York Road – Stop W. (This is counter-intuitive because the bus stops are on opposite sides of the road, but is correct). Each of these services runs approximately every 10 minutes and passes close to Blackfriars Station. The last 381 service is advertised as running after midnight, in fact 00.25.

Walking. The distance is 2.6km – at a moderate speed this is a 38 minute walk by the shortest route, or about 3km and 45 minutes using The Thames Path.

By River Bus. Walk to London Eye Pier and take Boat RB1 to London Bridge City Pier. This is an enjoyable but expensive option as an Adult Single ticket costs £7.15 – but great views of the City.... River buses from Waterloo run at 4, 24 and 44 minutes past the hour and take 24 minutes. For the return, after 20.49, the service is hourly and takes 33 minutes (so, 20:49, 21:49 and 22:49 are the last services).

PADDINGTON

Anyone for the West Country might like to consider travelling via Waterloo, rather than Paddington as Paddington is difficult to get to other than by underground (or taxi)_

For Bath, for example there is a direct trains leaving Bath Spa at 13:07 arriving at 15:49 and a further train leaving at 16:08 arriving 18:49

For the return journey, avoiding Paddington, the following is the last train/connection:

- London Waterloo to Reading 21.20 – 22.42
- Reading to Bath Spa 22-55 – 00.05

EUSTON, ST PANCRAS AND KING'S CROSS

For St Pancras and King's Cross, trains run via Thameslink from Blackfriars to St Pancras Intl every ten minutes (for St Pancras & King's Cross)

For **Euston** – buses 73, 59, 205, 30, 10 from St Pancras Stn – very frequent and take less than 10 minutes.

BLACKFRIARS

Walk to City Hall along the Thames Path or, if you prefer, take **Buses** nos 381 or RV1.

LIVERPOOL STREET STATION

London Bridge Station to Liverpool Street Station = **Bus** no. 149, which takes 15 minutes. Further **Buses** 48 and 72 take 23 minutes and run at approximately 10 minute intervals from Tower Bridge Road (closer to City Hall but a slower bus route!)

TOWER GATEWAY

Tower Gateway (DLR) provides connections to the DLR network, to the Overground at Shadwell and on to Stratford for connections to the Greater Anglian network
