SUMMARIES of AVs not in the ENGLISH LANGUAGE

- **8. Invisible Time:** The AV aims to document the essential moments that mark a day of life in a monastery, taking great care not to alter the spiritual atmosphere, and encapsulate the primary elements that one breathes inside the monastery, such as the Invisible presence of God and the Time by which the actions of the day are regulated. Every corner of the monastery is imbued with a spirituality so strong that it cannot be described.
- 24. Op' Art: Victor Vasarely, a Hungarian-French artist, is the pioneer of optical art. In the introduction, he talks about his vision and how the round drifts from the sun, the square derives from the window. The window is an opening to the light or an abyss if you look outside. These two notions of the sun and the window, one cosmic and therefore distant, the other, close, with the possibility of escape and the need to return inside, dark from the outside but which lights up when you are there. In this AV, the works of Victor Vasarely (in 2D) have been completely redesigned by the author and animated to transcend optical effects.
- **42.** The Two of Us: After Camilla's death, Clara retraces, in the places of her heart, the happy moments of their great love, blossomed like a white rose without season, despite everything and everyone. The AV is a hymn to Love that is stronger than prejudices, a hymn to the Freedom of conscious choices, a hymn to the Magic of Memory, a precious antidote to loneliness. Clara and Camilla play themselves with their true story.
- **49.** Le Vent Nous Portura: A song entitled "The Wind Will Carry Us". Everything will disappear or reappear.


The GRAND PRIX TROPHY



Also known as the George and Doreen Pollock Trophy, the Grand Prix Trophy is awarded to the winner of the RPS International AV Festival. The Trophy was designed by David Linley Furniture (now known as Linley), owned by Viscount Linley, now 2nd Earl of Snowdon. It was generously

purchased in 1990, by the late Arthur Packham, then Chairman of the RPS International AV Festival Committee. Arthur and his wife visited Viscount Linley's studio to select the design, which is reminiscent of the top of an Ionic column. Sir George Pollock was a founder member of the

RPS AV Group, and he was strongly supported by Lady Doreen. In later years, Arthur thought that being at the forefront of AV and leading lights in the AV world, the naming of the trophy "The George and Doreen Pollock Trophy" was a tribute to them both. Due to its value, the winner does not retain the Trophy, but they do receive an RPS Gold Medal and an RPS AV Group Silver Salver. In order to list the winners of the Grand Prix Trophy, а board was subsequently commissioned from Viscount Linley to record



the names of those who have received this award. The current holder of the Trophy is Judith Kimber FRPS, the Grand Prix winner from the last Festival in 2021. We await the Judges' decision to see who will have this honour in 2023

The TONY TROMAN THEATRE

The Tony Troman Theatre was made possible by the generous bequest of £650,000 to The Royal Photographic Society by Tony Troman ARPS APAGB. A very private person, Tony was born in Ewell, Surrey, in 1936. He contributed extensively to photographic administration, most often quietly in the background. He ran Friends Provident Photography Club for over 20 years and was on the Committee of Epsom Camera Club for over 30 years, becoming President in 2007. He became a member of The RPS in 1975 and in 1976 joined the Committee of the 1st RPS International AV Festival, with Sir George and Lady Doreen Pollock. He served until the 20th Festival in 2012, when he was presented with a retirement gift. Tony covered every RPS International AV Festival Committee role, including Chairman in 1994 and 1996. For his contribution to AV, he was awarded the RPS AV Group's Dobson Henry Medal in 1998 and in 2006 the Society awarded him the Fenton Medal. Tony died peacefully at his home of 65 years on 9th February 2014. A gentle man and a gentleman, Tony left no family, but will be remembered by his many AV and photography friends, and for the Tony Troman Theatre at RPS House.
